Getting to Eureka Springs has never been easier!

We're less than two hours from Springfield, MO and just under three hours from Tulsa. You can be here from Kansas City in roughly four hours, and from Memphis, Wichita, Shreveport, and St. Louis in roughly six hours.

We're only 85 minutes away from Northwest Arkansas Regional Airport (XNA,) to our west and Branson Airport in Branson, MO to our north.

Airlines into XNA are Allegiant, American Airlines American Eagle, Continental, Delta, US Airways Express or United, coming from Las Vegas, LA, Orlando, Chicago, Detroit, Minneapolis/St. Paul, Cincinnati, Dallas/Ft. Worth, Houston, Denver, Charlotte, Memphis, Atlanta, New York or Newark. Visit www.nwara.com/ for flight information.

Branson Airport is served by AirTran, Frontier or Branson AirExpress from Atlanta Baltimore, Orlando, Chicago, Milwaukee, Houston, Dallas, Austin, Phoenix or Denver. Visit www.flybranson.com/ for flight information.

Private planes and jet craft can land at Carroll County Airport, only 8 miles east of Eureka Springs in Berryville. The airport manager is on duty Mon. – Fri., 8 a.m.- 3:30 p.m., and airport fueling is open 24/7. The newly expanded and rebuilt airport has a courtesy car available by reservation for your convenience. Love the water?

A 20-minute drive out US 62 W takes you to the Beaver Dam and Lake on the White River. There's great trout fishing, smooth water for canoe/kayak float trips, and at the lake above the dam you can camp, fish, hike, swim, and enjoy nature.

Roughly 11 miles north of town is the marina at Holiday Island (on Table Rock Lake) where you can rent speed or pontoon boats.

20 minutes east, the Kings River offers fishing, float trips, and swimming.

Our 1600-acre Lake Leatherwood City Park, is crisscrossed with hiking and biking trails, and the 85-acre spring-fed lake is perfect for a day of swimming, boating or fishing. Take US 62 west 4 miles.

Just a short drive west of the intersection of Hwy 23 and US 62, turn south on Oil Springs Rd to arrive at Black Bass Lake Park, where you can fish from the banks or from non-motorized boats. Good hiking and biking trails, too.

And remember to visit some of our beautiful springs in their lush pocket parks. After all, we are the town that water built, and the springs started it all.

Motorcycle noise

Please ride quietly. Hwy 23 through Eureka Springs is surrounded by homes and businesses, and the limestone bluffs amplify sounds. We welcome all our visitors, but please respect our community. The state of Arkansas has a noisy muffler statute that limits noise. If you're stopped for violating the statute, you will receive citation; fines start at \$125.

Parking

There are parking meters on downtown streets and in downtown lots. If you prefer not to drive, park in the transit lot at the intersection of US 62 and Hwy 23 and catch a trolley to take you around town. There is also a transit facility west of the intersection of US 62 and Hwy 23 where parking and trolleys are available.

Best hint from locals

This is a mountain town, so wear good shoes for walking. Walking tour maps are available at the Chamber of Commerce and the Historical Museum on S. Main St.

Emergency health care
